1 POLICY

1. Students graduating from CMCC with a Doctor of Chiropractic degree must meet the following criteria necessary for graduation:
 - a. successful completion of all academic program requirements with a minimum CGPA of 2.0
 - b. fulfillment of all administrative and financial obligations to CMCC.
2. Students graduating from a Graduate Studies Chiropractic Residency Programs at CMCC must meet the following criteria necessary for graduation:
 - a. successful completion of all courses and academic requirements with a minimum CGPA of 3.0
 - b. fulfillment of all administrative and financial obligations to CMCC.
3. A student is deemed to have graduated if/when they have been conferred the degree or diploma for their program of study.
4. A student must fulfill all graduation eligibility criteria at least 14 days prior to the graduation date.
5. Graduation Honours are awarded as follows:
 - Cum Laude: Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.70
 - Magna Cum Laude: Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.80
 - Summa Cum Laude: Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.90
6. The official date of graduation is the latter of the date of the Convocation ceremony or the date upon which a student is conferred their degree/diploma.

2 PURPOSE

To outline the requirements for graduation from CMCC with a degree or diploma from a student's approved program of study.

3 SCOPE

All students.

4 INFORMATION AND COMPLIANCE PLANS (not a comprehensive list)

CMCC's degree granting authority was awarded by consent of the Ontario Ministry, Training, Colleges and Universities under the *Post-secondary Education Choice and Excellence Act, 2000*.

Graduation does not give the graduate the right to practice. Authority to practice may be obtained by fulfilling the qualifications of the appropriate jurisdiction required by the regulatory body.

The CMCC Graduate Studies Chiropractic Residency Programs diploma does not give the graduate the right to practice as a chiropractic specialist. Achievement of Fellowship status from one of the specialty colleges of the Federation of Canadian Chiropractic may be obtained by fulfilling the qualifications required by the appropriate specialty college, at which time the right to specialty practice may be conferred by that college.

6 DEFINITIONS

Convocation is the annual ceremony through which CMCC celebrates the graduation of its students.

The Student Promotion Committee is the Committee that reviews student promotion into higher years of study and determines eligibility to graduate, as per the terms of the Student Promotion – Undergraduate and the Student Promotion – Graduate Studies Chiropractic Residency Programs policies.

7 PROCEDURES

1. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all academic, administrative and financial requirements have been met before graduation. Such requirements are defined in CMCC policy and in the Academic Calendar.
2. In exceptional circumstances, whereby a student has made significant progress toward completion of degree requirements and is subsequently deceased, the Promotion Committee may recommend to the President that the student's degree be posthumously awarded.
3. Degrees or diplomas will only be released on or after the date of graduation.
