## <u>Graduate Studies Program - Exit Competencies</u>

Graduates of the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC) Graduate Studies Program are primary contact health care professionals with advanced specialist level knowledge in spinal and musculoskeletal health emphasizing differential diagnosis, patient centered care, teaching, research and consultations. CMCC has adopted CanMEDS educational framework<sup>1</sup> for a competency-based education for both its Doctor of Chiropractic Program and Graduate Studies Program.

Competency in health professional education is defined as a demonstrable ability of a health professional that develops through stages of expertise from novice to clinician to specialist. The Graduate Studies competency framework describes seven roles that will be satisfied through several key competencies.
